LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

The NGAW Legislative Committee, led by newly appointed Legislative Chair Charles Barnett, was hard at work during the recent Washington State 2022 legislative session, which ran from January 10 until March 10. The Committee's main focus was SB 5614/HB 1642, which expands access to the National Guard Post-Secondary Grant Program. Barnett and NGAW member BG Gent Welsh testified in the Senate Higher Education & Workforce Development Committee Hearing in support of the bill. The bill passed both houses and was signed into law on March 17!

The broader areas of concern the Committee is now focusing on, even though they may not have a specific proposal yet, include childcare for Drill Weekends, free





Discover Passes and Fishing Licenses for Guardsmen, benefits parity with Active Duty, and State Active Duty benefits and pay. The Legislative Committee has been researching those topics, reaching out to local businesses and lawmakers, as well as other states. Once they have a better understanding of the issues, they can craft resolutions to bring before NGAUS and EANGUS.

CAPITOL SUMMIT

Are you a Company Grade Officer interested in learning more about the impact **you** can have as a member of NGAW? Contact the NGAW office for more information about attending the NGAUS Capitol Summit July 17-19.



The Capitol Summit is a professional development program NGAUS offers to National Guard Company Grade Officers, Second Lieutenant to Captain or Warrant Officer 1 to Chief Warrant Officer 3. The program brings together Guardsmen from each state and territory for a close look at how the government works and the role NGAUS plays in the legislative process. It also includes a congressional component where participants will have the opportunity to meet with congressional offices.

2022 SCHOLARSHIPS

NGAW members and their dependents are eligible to apply for a variety of scholarships offered by NGAW, the NGAW Foundation and USAA (enlisted only). Multiple scholarships are available, starting at \$500.

Applicants must be a current paid or lifetime member of NGAW or the dependent of a current paid or lifetime member (Officer or Enlisted). Applicants may only apply for one scholarship, and must submit an essay and two letters of recommendation. For current Guardsmen, one letter must come from the Unit Commander or the First Sergeant. All applications must be submitted online by the May 27, 2022 deadline.
