The conference kicked off with EANGUS' first ever 5k Run to support the We Care for America Foundation--a charity providing emergency financial grants to National Guard members and their families.

other members of Area VII (Alaska, California, Hawaii, Oregon, and Guam) to discuss summaries of committee meetings and national resolution priorities. It was wonderful to network and learn about their lobbying efforts to promote equity of benefits for their Service Members and improve retention rates for their states. While all resolutions approved were agreed upon by NGAW delegates, some noteworthy resolutions were NDAA support for increasing AGR End Strength, the ANG federal tuition assistance proposal, and of course, Tricare for All.



Our Professional Development Attendees SSG Stormy White, SSgt Adelina Milano, TSgt Derek Holmgren, and SPC Eric Smith performed superbly in developing and briefing a Capstone with their peers. They also had an opportunity to participate in Speed Mentoring and gained valuable knowledge from the leadership panel consisting of SEA Tony Whitehead, CSM John Raines, and CCM Maurice Williams. They were able to witness the voting-in of the new EANGUS Executive Council, to include our very own CSM Retired Bob Sweeney as the new Vice President of EANGUS.

Our PDs had glowing things to say about their experience, including "I learned a lot about the organization and had valuable face to face time with CSMs during Speed Mentoring," and "Speed Mentoring was a very positive experience for me! I wish I was able to watch more of the actual conference."

OCTOBER CAPITOL SUMMIT


Earlier this month, I attended the Fall NGAUS Capitol Summit. This was an experience that yielded dividends on behalf of NGAW through the relationships built and knowledge gained during three days in our nation's capital.

The Capitol Summit commenced with a crash course on the history of the National Guard and the federal legislative process. We learned about the complexity of navigating multiple agencies and bodies on "The Hill" in drafting a legislative proposal, and how NGB prioritizes programs such as the State Partnership Program and healthcare for Service Members in accordance with congressional objectives. Speakers such as MajGen April Vogel (Director, NGB Legislative Liaison), LTG Jon Jensen (Director, Army National Guard), and LtGen Michael Loh (Director, Air National Guard) briefed us on the future of the National Guard, including the Guard's continuously evolving role as an



operational reserve in our National Security Strategy, and the implications for our Services considering the uncertainty produced by current world events. Participants were also briefed on several broadening opportunities for officers, such as the Congressional Fellowship and Legislative Liaison programs.

During our short time in Washington, D.C., two events stood out as particularly salient to me: advocating on behalf of our Soldiers and Airmen to Congress and building relationships with participants from other states and territories. I was part of a group of nominees that briefed a senior staffer from Senator Dianne Feinstein's office on the importance of Zero Cost TRICARE for our Soldiers and Airmen, including the profound positive effect such a program would have on medical readiness throughout the force. The conversations I had with other participants bore fruit via identifying common issues faced by associations across different states/territories and identifying



lines of effort where we can partner across state lines to make an impact on behalf of Service Members.

Capitol Summit is an incredible opportunity to learn more about the legislative process at the Federal level and how NGAW can learn from NGAUS, as well as from our sister associations across the 54 states and territories. If you are a CGO or CW2 looking to make an impact on behalf of Soldiers and Airmen, I cannot recommend the Capitol Summit highly enough. You can be a voice at the highest level on our behalf and really make a difference.


We're already looking ahead to plan another tournament next spring (and next fall), so watch our website and social media for dates, registration, and more information.
